WELCOME and INTRODUCTION TO THEME

Welcome to our Kirk in Penicuik service.

This is when as Church of Scotland congregations we join together for worship. On these Sundays we're currently following a framework called *Holy Habits*.

This emphasises 10 specific Christian practices that can help nurture our Christian Discipleship.

Over the past few months, we've looked at worship together, praying, serving, and signs & wonders.

We hope that you've found this stimulating and helpful in your daily Christian walk. By looking at these together as churches we can hold the big picture of Christian life and worship.

This month our theme is Breaking Bread.

Jesus gave us few specific commands for Christian worship, but this was one of them: *Take bread and wine as I do*,

bless it (that's give thanks to God for it),

break it and share it.

I wonder what you call this special meal?

Eucharist, Mass, Communion, Holy Communion, The Lord's Supper...

We'll be thinking about this as we reflect together on what it means for Jesus to be expressed in the breaking of bread and the pouring out of wine:

'Taste and see that the Lord is good.'

READINGS

John 6.25-40 (NIV)

When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"

Reader: Heather Nicholas (StM)

Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?"

Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent."

So they asked him, "What sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you? What will you do? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written: 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'"

Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." "Sir," they said, "always give us this bread."

Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. And this is the will of

him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day."

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."
