THE STORY SO FAR

In chapter 8, David would like to build a house (a temple) for the Lord in Jerusalem, but God refuses this. However, God promises instead to build him a house (to extend his family and dynasty). Building a temple is to be left to a descendant of David's.

In chapter 9, David continues to wage war against Israel's enemies and, through God, succeeds in subduing them. By modern standards of ethical warfare, David is cruel and ruthless. However, compared with the standards of his day, which often led to the total slaughter of prisoners, he might be regarded as lenient, though the storyteller records his actions without comment. In a potential contrast. the storyteller says that David's domestic administration is "just and right for all his people".

In chapter 10, the story zooms in on the royal court: and the results of a binding promise that David made years before to his friend, Jonathan, King Saul's son.

BIBLE READINGS (Geoff and Sheena Dawe) 2 Samuel 9: 1-13 (CSB)

David asked, "Is there anyone remaining from the family of Saul I can show kindness to for Jonathan's sake?" There was a servant of Saul's family named Ziba. They summoned him to David, and the king said to him, "Are you Ziba?"

"I am your servant," he replied.

So the king asked, "Is there anyone left of Saul's family that I can show the kindness of God to?"

Ziba said to the king, "There is still Jonathan's son who was injured in both feet." The king asked him, "Where is he?"

Ziba answered the king, "You'll find him in Lo-debar at the house of Machir son of Ammiel." So King David had him brought from the house of Machir son of Ammiel in Lo-debar.

Mephibosheth son of Jonathan son of Saul came to David, fell face-down, and paid homage. David said, "Mephibosheth!"

"I am your servant," he replied.

"Don't be afraid," David said to him, "since I intend to show you kindness for the sake of your father Jonathan. I will restore to you all your grandfather Saul's fields, and you will always eat meals at my table."

Mephibosheth paid homage and said, "What is your servant that you take an interest in a dead dog like me?"

Then the king summoned Saul's attendant Ziba and said to him, "I have given to your master's grandson all that belonged to Saul and his family. You, your sons, and your servants are to work the ground for him, and you are to bring in the crops so your master's grandson will have food to eat. But Mephibosheth, your master's grandson, is always to eat at my table." Now Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants.

Ziba said to the king, "Your servant will do all my lord the king commands."

So Mephibosheth ate at David's table just like one of the king's sons. Mephibosheth had a young son whose name was Mica. All those living in Ziba's house were Mephibosheth's servants. However, Mephibosheth lived in Jerusalem because he always ate at the king's table. His feet had been injured.

Look at it this way: At the right time, while we were still helpless, Christ died for ungodly people. Finding someone who would die for a godly person is rare. Maybe someone would have the courage to die for a good person. Christ died for us while we were still sinners. This demonstrates God's love for us.

Since Christ's blood has now given us God's approval, we are even more certain that Christ will save us from God's anger. If the death of his Son restored our relationship with God while we were still his enemies, we are even more certain that, because of this restored relationship, the life of his Son will save us. In addition, our Lord Jesus Christ lets us continue to brag about God. After all, it is through Christ that we now have this restored relationship with God.
