We aim together to raise £2,000 by the end of November. We want to show the families a warm welcome. We can do this by enabling them to go shopping and choose items for themselves, to help turn an empty house into a proper home.

Heavenly Father, Almighty God, Adonai,

Lord, we bring before your throne of grace our prayers for others, asking that you will empower your people here to lay down our lives in service of your kingdom, that we will see others as you see them. , that you will love as you have taught us, that we will reach out our arms not only to those we know but to those we have yet to encounter. Inspire us to share our knowledge and love of you, that your spirit will reign throughout Penicuik.

We bring our prayers for a world divided, lost, hungry, and at war. In a world driven by greed and the desire for conquest, we remember, Father, the ongoing Covid epidemic throughout the world. We pray that Africa will receive more of the vaccine to take it beyond 4%, and that Burundi and Eritrea will be given vaccine to start immunising their population. Lord, send your holy spirit to be with all those who have lost loved ones during this dreadful time, and build in us a loving desire to reach out to those in need. We remember those countries living in dire poverty such as Honduras, El Salvador,

Guatemala, Venezuela, Lebanon and Syria. Father, in a world that has plenty, it is hard to understand that poverty exists to such an extent. Nurture governments to grow in

wisdom, stir in your people everywhere a deep desire to reach out to those in need with your love and compassion, strengthen our voices that we may be heard as a powerful wind above the cacophony of noise.

Lord, we raise up the country of Afghanistan before you. We pray that peacemakers will arise within the Taliban, and that fear, retribution, poverty and discrimination will diminish and pass away. Lay your hands upon them, Lord. We give thanks that in many parts of the country girls are being allowed to attend school: be with these teachers and students. Inspire governments throughout the world to reach out rather than back away in this growing need for economic assistance. We remember the Afghan refugees coming to Penicuik, and pray that they will find friendship, compassion and peace among us.

Father, we give thanks for COP26 and that a resolution was reached. Give courage to governments to sustain these decisions, and to all peoples an empathy with the need to refrain from mis-use of the world's resources. Lord, let eyes be opened to the beauty you created.

We pray for countries at war: not only those who battle with weapons, but for those who battle for dominance which prevails over the needs of the people.

Abba, we pray for our nation and the many people whose lives have changed as a result of Covid, for those who have lost loved ones, and those struggling with issues of mental health;, for those frightened to leave their homes. Inspire organisations to reach out to those in need. We give you thanks for Renew Wellbeing, and especially the outreach in Penicuik. We raise up FFF and the foodbanks in Penicuik, and ask your blessing on them and on the many throughout the country which bring relief to those in need. We ask for your blessing on all aid organisations, thinking of Bethany as we approach the cold of winter. Bring workers to the fore as people seek places to sleep. We give thanks for CAP and for the ongoing work done with people in financial crisis. Father – there's so much work to be done: pour out your spirit on this town and on this country.

Give us your grace and blessing to unite these two congregations, and the fruits and gifts to be your people of faith and love in this town.

Father, in all these situations we ask for your hands to rest on those who can make a difference, who can work for peace, for empathy and for resolution; and in all this, that your kingdom will grow, the words of your people will bring transformation, and that the name of Jesus will be lifted high above the nations.

All our prayers we ask in Jesus' name, using the prayer he taught his followers:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts,
as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom,
