BIBLE READINGS

Exodus 34.29-35 (NIV-UK)

When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the Lord had given him on Mount Sinai. When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. But whenever he entered the Lord's presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, they saw that his face was radiant. Then Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the Lord.

About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfilment at Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, 'Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters – one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' (He did not know what he was saying.)

While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A voice came from the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.' When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

The next day, when they came down from the mountain, a large crowd met him. A man in the crowd called out, 'Teacher, I beg you to look at my son, for he is my only child. A spirit seizes him and he suddenly screams; it throws him into convulsions so that he foams at the mouth. It scarcely ever leaves him and is destroying him. I begged your disciples to drive it out, but they could not.'

'You unbelieving and perverse generation,' Jesus replied, 'how long shall I stay with you and put up with you? Bring your son here.'

Even while the boy was coming, the demon threw him to the ground in a convulsion. But Jesus rebuked the impure spirit, healed the boy and gave him back to his father. And they were all amazed at the greatness of God.

FOLLOWING JESUS' EXAMPLE AND COMMAND

So now we do as Jesus did and commanded us to do. We take this bread and wine (the ordinary things of the world) which Christ, in his own way, will make special, and as he prayed before sharing, let us pray:

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Praise be to you, our Father, for your Son Jesus Christ. He walked with his disciples, taught them and shared meals with them. He lived and died for love of us, and, after rising from the dead, he wonderfully met with his disciples. He ascended into heaven and through the power of the Holy Spirit he is with us now. And so we join the saints and angels, echoing your praise throughout the world and saying:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

As we remember his death on the cross, his sacrifice made once for all to save us, we rejoice in his living presence. Send your Holy Spirit to us, that the bread that we break and the cup that we bless may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Unite us with him and with all God's people in heaven and on earth.

Let's join together in the family prayer of the Church:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever. Amen.

THE SHARING

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes again. We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ. (the bread is broken) We take this wine to share in the Blood of Christ. (the cup is raised) We believe that he who lived, died and rose again for us will meet us here. Jesus said: 'This is my body. It's given for you. Do this to remember me.' (we eat the bread) Jesus said: 'This cup is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Drink it, all of you, to remember me.' (we drink the cup)

THE PEACE (using British Sign Language) The peace of the Lord Jesus be with you all.

PRAYERS FOR OTHERS

Heavenly Father, we thank you for that picture of your son in his dazzling glory, which we think about on this particular Sunday before the shadow of the cross falls dark across our Lenten path.

We remember too, though, the failure of the disciples at the foot of the mountain; and so we ask you to strengthen *our* faith now as we reach out in prayer to the people of Ukraine.

Lord, it's so hard for most of us to imagine the darkness that engulfs them now. We, and all the world, are shocked and saddened by the brutal abuse of power that is laying waste their country.

We remember all who are living in fear for their lives and their future; all who are fleeing their homes in panic and uncertainty; all who are ill all who have been injured; all who are already mourning the loss of family, neighbours, friends or strangers.

We pray for all agencies in the country struggling to bring whatever relief they can health workers and the emergency services, churches,

folk just trying to help one another out and keep things going.

We pray for men and women in the military full-time or reservists called on to defend their country in unthinkable circumstances. And we pray earnestly and insistently for peace. [Silence] King of kings and Lord of lords, grant wisdom and discernment to all in our work

grant wisdom and discernment to all in our world who can bring help and influence to bear on achieving this as quickly as possible.

We dare to pray also, Lord, for the millions of Russians, who will be shocked and deeply ashamed by what their leaders have done. We know that they are held helpless in the cruel grip of a tyrant and his cohort. Let the Holy Spirit come upon them, who live in what was once known as Holy Russia, for their own good and the good of all the world.

Make our world ready, Lord, to generously offer whatever practical help becomes possible; and to persist in prayer. And above all, let the people of Ukraine know your love. [Silence]

This morning we have already prayed together in the words given to us by Jesus himself. Heavenly Father, hear these words again this time in the Ukrainian language.
