LIGHTING OF THE FIRST ADVENT CANDLE: HOPE

The prophet Isaiah says:

'The people walking in darkness see a bright light;

light shines on those who live in a land of deep darkness...

For a child has been born to us,

a son has been given to us.' [Isaiah 9]

INTRODUCTION TO THE READINGS

Psalm 36 at first appears to be all about the 'wicked': the way sin speaks to the hearts of those who have no time for God and all the troubling things they get involved in.

But midway, the psalm changes direction: it erupts into exuberant praise of the God that David knows: a God of goodness, fairness, faithfulness and generosity. This leads up to a picture of God's life and light flowing out to all in a refreshing stream of goodness and truth:

The fountain of life flows from you.

Your light lets us see light.

The poet's celebration of God's loving, self-giving nature enables him to speak with confidence about God's enduring love for those who respond to his grace and about the final destiny of those who have no time for God.

The Gospel as told by John also speaks of the life and light of God. It's a light which the darkness of our human world can neither understand nor overcome. And, John says, this light came into the world in a human life, in Jesus.
